Father Flanagan's Letter to the Successors of Boys Town November 25, 1939

In this, the year 1939, we are laying the corner-stone of the Immaculate Conception Church, made possible through the munificence of Miss Mary A. Dowd of New York City, that homeless and abandoned boys of the Nation may have an opportunity of worshipping God in this beautiful edifice.

The church is costing between \$178,000.00 and \$200,000.00, and the boys who will have been benefited through the spiritual blessings of this beautiful edifice, erected in honor of the Immaculate Mother, will have gone out into the world and, through Her help and intercession, made the world a better place in which to live.

My humble request is—that those who will come after me will carry on this Christ-like work, of saving homeless and abandoned boys for God and country—to please pray for the writer of this letter, and all of those engaged in this work at this time, who will long since have gone to their reward.

Words from Pope Paul VI— August 29, 1967 on the occasion of the Golden Jubilee of Boys Town

The profound love, understanding and concern of the late Monsignor Flanagan for youth, especially those from disturbed or broken homes, have led into the paths of righteousness, of civil education, of physical health and intellectual advancement, more than eleven thousand boys, among whom nearly thirty have entered the priesthood or the Religious life. No further proof is needed of the efficacy and fruitfulness of the Christian principles which he applied, and which continue to inspire, with most praiseworthy results, his worthy successor as Director, Monsignor Nicholas H. Wegner.

Born July 13, 1886, Leabeg Farm, Co. Roscommon near Ballymoe, County Galway, Ireland.

*

Ordained, July 26, 1912, Innsbruck, Austria.

*

Founded Father Flanagan's Boys' Home, 25th & Dodge, Omaha, December 12, 1917.

*

Moved Home to German-American Home, South 13th St., Omaha, June 1, 1918.

*

Moved to Overlook Farm (present site) October 17, 1921.

*

Invested as a monsignor, November 21, 1937.

*

World premiere of movie, "Boys Town," September 7, 1938.

*

Assessed the child care system in native Ireland on visit there, June, 1946.

*

Met General MacArthur in Japan to develop care program for war orphans.

*

Sent to Europe by President Truman to aide war orphans. February 26, 1948.

*

Died May 15, 1948, Berlin, Germany

From Father Flanagan's writing of April 1, 1946
