## BOYS TOWN TIMES, AUGUST 13, 1943

Have you ever known a boy who couldn't trust himself? A boy who never seemed to get anything done because he could never be sure that he would finish what he started? He had high ambitions, but he never quite reached the goals or ideals he might have. This boy wasn't fair to himself, because he wasn't true to himself.

...That same boy couldn't always be depended on by people who knew him. His friends all liked him, but they could never be sure that he would do what he said he was going to do. He was a good boy, but he didn't know he couldn't be true to his friends if he were not true to himself.

I've known such boys and I know you have. If you think carefully, you'll probably see some reflection of your own life in their actions... it's so easy for us all to be untrue to our own selves by doing things that we know are wrong, or by neglecting to do the things we know are right and should be done...

By making our own characters strong individually we can be sure we are doing our part to make us stand strong together. I've always urged you to help others and if possible do what they want you to do, but you're not helping your own character to foolishly do everything they say...If you know that not doing it is the right thing, you can show that you have a mind of your own by using your will power and saying "no." And, by doing so, you will be true to yourself, for you will be doing yourself some good.

When I say will power, I don't mean the idle word you speak so lightly of and are so sure you've got...it's carrying out the plans you've set up for your own good, regardless of what looks good to you at the moment; it's telling the truth when a little white lie is the easy way out of some difficulty.

No, will power isn't just a word, it's very much alive and goes hand in hand through life with truth... it is only through will power that our moral characters can be developed to the high degree of goodness that is truly intended for us.

...In the church, we try to tell you what is right and what is wrong, but after that, it's in your own hands...it is only by living a clean, healthy life that we can get all the good out of life that God intended us to, but to do so, we must do more than think of doing it. Thinking right is far removed from acting right...you alone know whether you are doing what is right. Now is the time to cultivate a good moral character...It's easy to find boys who can recognize what is right from wrong, but it's harder to find one who always will stand up for what is right in the face of oppositions. I don't mean that this will result in you being perfect...
