FATHER FLANAGAN'S WRITINGS Sermon delivered on the Golden Jubilee of the

Diocese of Omaha, December 8, 1935, *Part I*

...The history of the diocese of Omaha which must necessarily be the topic of my sermon is the history of apostolic zeal on the part of Bishops and Priests eager and yearning for the expansion of the Kingdom of Christ upon earth...

...Well might we celebrate today with grateful hearts, this Golden Jubilee. Well might we raise our hearts and minds and voices in thanksgiving to Almighty God and His Immaculate Mother this day. Well might we rejoice because of our gift of faith, a faith that has produced such men and women during the past history of the church in Nebraska, who have set us so noble an example of a truly missionary zeal like unto the Apostles in the early Church.

...The Vicariate of Nebraska was established by the Holy Father on the 6th of January, 1857, 28 years before the diocese of Omaha came into being. The first Vicar Apostolic to serve this territory was an Irish Trappist Monk from the new Mt. Mellery, near Dubuque, Iowa...His jurisdiction covered the present states of Nebraska, the two Dakotas west of the Missouri River, the whole state of Wyoming, and the state of Montana lying east of the Rocky mountains—a territory extending over some 375,000 square miles. He found over this great expanse of country a Catholic population of about 300 families of white settlers living along the river counties, and a few thousand Indians chiefly in Montana. He had two secular Priests and a Jesuit priest, the latter working mostly among the natives in Montana...His method of appointing a Priest in charge of a certain territory was quite unique and far removed from the canonical method now employed. He would take the Priest to the back door of his residence and looking out over that vast expanse of territory-hundreds of thousands of square miles, he would say, "Father, you go in that direction," pointing the way with his hand.

I might state here that prior to the coming of Bishop O'Gorman as Vicar Apostolic, this territory was cared for under the jurisdiction of that famous Missionary Jesuit, Bishop Miege. The first Mass said in Omaha was in the Old State House which occupied that ground where Central High School now stands. This Mass was said either on the 14th or 15th of May, 1855, by a Father W. Edmonds

stationed for a time at Council Bluffs. Reverend Thomas Scanlon from St. Louis diocese dedicated the first Church in Omaha—St. Mary's, in 1856. The first resident Pastor was the Rev. John Cavanaugh...Rev. William Kelly was the first Priest ordained in the state of Nebraska...June 25, 1859.

The first Vicar Apostolic of Nebraska was a man of real missionary spirit. He went forth on the Missions just like his few Priests whom he seldom saw, preaching, baptizing, confirming, bringing the word of God to the scattered members of the flock, giving his all with real apostolic zeal for Christ and Christ's cause.

Bishop O'Gorman was not unmindful of the need of Catholic education of the youth even in those early days, when money was scarce, and Catholics few and scattered. He was blessed in finding an Order of Nuns who realized his needs and were inspired by his missionary spirit. These religious women forearmed by prayer and a willingness to sacrifice came and ministered to the lambs of the flock.

The Sisters of Mercy of the Vicariate of Nebraska, and later of the dioceses of Omaha,...landed in Omaha, October, 1864. Like the early women in the Gospel, they came out here to the then, vast unknown...They established schools, an orphanage, later a hospital...For 14 years they were the only Order of Religious women in the territory.
