When these boys grow up they will always look with gratitude on the city that has taken them in, when they were homeless and gave them an education to fight life's battle with... They will be boosters for Omaha and an asset to Omaha's welfare.

"Our Farm Home"

Father Flanagan's Boys' Home Journal, May 1920

After a long and dreary winter of a shut-in monotony as a protection against the cold, snows and rain, our boys are almost beside themselves with joy at the oncoming of the beautiful sun shining into our poor quarters to cheer us all with a new hope.

For some time now they have been enjoying the outdoor exercise, playing marbles, practicing on the small terrace for the ball team, and romping around on the young green grass. We find a decided change in their temperaments and whole make up since they have been allowed out of doors and their long pent-up energies, now set forth in all harmless and healthful outdoor sports make them much more subservient to our rules and discipline, and much more responsive to our appeals.

Our much discussed Farm Home is still not a reality and is the general topic of conversation among the bigger boys especially, who have had the privilege of visiting the Farm, and working there on Saturdays. They speak in glowing terms of the place to the others, and are constantly asking us, "When do we start the New Home, Father?" Little do they know of the difficulties and disappointments that are met with every day in connection with this matter. Little do they think of the necessary expense of building, and how difficult it is to interest men of wealth in this project. Money is the first essential and that we may build to care for our present needs, almost Two Hundred Thousand Dollars are needed. Fifty thousand have already been subscribed and our farm is now, thank God, and thanks to our benefactors, out of debt.

What of the future rests in the hands of an All-pitying God Who sees the many sacrifices that must necessarily be met with boldly before our final aim is accomplished. And when we answer those oft repeated questions of our poor boys concerning our New Home we have to tell them that they must pray more fervently and devoutly. All good things come from God and if men only realized this fact and that they are only trustees of earthly goods which must be divided among God's poor and

neglected ones in a prudent and constructive manner, then our boys would long ago have had a real Home and every homeless boy would find a refuge in that home to be given every chance to grow up a child of God and a useful citizen of the country.

That these boys must be given a chance to live, grow and expand, goes without mention. Every boy in this great country of ours has a natural right to this. Men of means and influence, men who are leaders in our communities of finances, business and commerce must recognize this fact and must get together to finance and encourage works of this kind.
