Father Flanagan's trip to Ireland, June, 1946; Source: report on his trip

Father Flanagan arrived by Pan-American Clipper at Rinneanna, Ireland, Saturday, June 8, having left New York June 7. Accompanied by his brother, Rev. P. A. Flanagan, pastor of Holy Angels Church, Omaha.

Met at the airport by their sister, Mrs. Kate Staunton, Ballymoe, Castlerea, and by nephews, Dr. W. P. Staunton, Ballymoe, and Mr. Edward Norton, Ballygar, where another sister, Mrs. Mary J. Norton, resides. Also welcomed by three representatives of the Past Pupils' Union of Summerhill College, Sligo, where he received his early education.

The family later drove to the family home at Leabeg, Ballymoe. Welcomed in a simple and joyful homecoming. Hundreds of children gathered around the car that brought him from Rinneanna to Ballymoe. Bonfires blazed outside Ballymoe. Scrolls bore the simple inscription "Welcome", and bunting and tricolors spanned the streets. At Fuerty, a few miles from Ballymoe, he was met by a procession of cars which escorted him to Ballymoe.

He visited Belfast, where 50,000 people lined a two-mile route into the city. With Most Rev. Dr. Mageean, Bishop of Down and Connor, drove in an open motor car, escorted by 3,000 members of the Catholic and Gaelic youth organizations. Reception and dinner.

- June 18- Address at Corrigan Park, Belfast. Opening of Youth Week at Corrigan Park.
- June 19- Press conference at Theatre Royal, Dublin.
Met Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, Most Rev. Dr. Cohalan. Met Bishop of Limerick, Most Rev. Dr. O'Neill.

 - June 21- Presented with model of Cross of Cong and four Celtic knobs, by Lord Mayor of Dublin
 - June 22- Visited Artane School, Dublin

 - June 28- Visited Summerhill College, Sligo. Visited Bishop of Elphin, Most Rev. Dr. Doorly.
 - June 30- Reception at Castlerea, County Roscommon.
 - July 6— Family reunion at Banba Hotel, Salthill, Galway.
 - July 6— Lecture in Waterford.
 - July 7— Lecture at Savoy Cinema, Limerick, Cork. Met with his Grace, Most Rev. Dr. D'Alton, Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland. Also His Grace, the Most Rev. Dr. McQuade, Archbishop of Dublin and Primate of Ireland.
- Visited the Borstal in Belfast, and prisons, reform schools, and industrial schools throughout Ireland.
